MULTISPORTS FACILITY

A planning application for work at the Day Centre to overcome noise problems associated with new venting equipment has been submitted to East Cambridgeshire Planning Officers. Work will commence once planning permission has been received. The Day Centre remains open during this time.

BURWELL MASTERPLAN

The Burwell Masterplan as agreed by the village and the Masterplan working group was officially accepted by East Cambridgeshire District Council as part of the Local Plan for the coming 20 years in a meeting in early 2014.

However the Government Inspector overseeing the Local Plan is not in agreement with the figures put forward by East Cambridgeshire, particularly for the number of houses to be delivered in the next five years. Therefore the Plan, including the Burwell Masterplan, is now under review. This means that there is a danger that Burwell will be forced to accept more development than the 350 houses on the Newmarket Road site plus infill that was agreed.

Despite being assured that no Burwell sites are earmarked for additional development within the Framework, the Parish Council has been told that two major proposals from developers are currently being considered by East Cambridgeshire Planning Officers. One is on land at Reach Road, formerly the DS Smith industrial site. The other is on land between Ness Road and Toyse Lane. The Dial-a-ride service is set to change. From September through to March the service will operate once monthly, on the first Thursday. The service is open to anyone in the village - there are no age or mobility restraints and costs just £5 return (£2.50 with bus pass).

The Parish Council has been funding the service however has not been used enough to cover costs of the minibus meaning extra costs have had to be paid out from Parish Council funds. Unfortunately the council is unable to continue to fund the service to this extent on a regular basis and so the service is in danger of being stopped unless more people use it.
